## Users

---

User statistics: In 2009 (Jan 1 - Oct 14), over 29,440 page loads (up from 22,404 for same period in 2008), with 8,973 unique visitors (8,149 in 2008).

**Most accessed page on the site** (besides the home page): Protocols page -- 1621 views in 2009 to date.

**Most access document in the Library:** *MIA-STEP* Blending Team Product -- 447 views in 2009 to date.

**28 protocols now have documents in the library:** CTN-0001, 0002, 0003, 0004, 0005, 0006, 0007, 0008, 0009, 0010, 0011, 0012, 0013, 0014, 0015, 0016, 0017, 0018, 0019, 0020, 0021, 0027, 0028, 0029, 0030, 0031, 0032, 0036.

**Access to Documents:** Links all Open-Access articles are provided (including those in PubMed Central). For articles requiring subscriptions, an email link is provided so that library users can request a copy from the CTN Library. **Following the Dissemination Workshop in March 2009, requests for articles increased nearly six-fold!** (121 for April-June 2009, up from only 19 for April-June 2008.) Many of the requests come from clinicians and CTN node coordinators.

**PubMed Central:** The Library links to free author manuscripts in PubMed Central, when these become available. As of October 2009, **44 articles** (33%) **have free author manuscripts posted** at PubMed Central. (We are also noting PMCID and NIHMS numbers on records.)

## Submissions & Services

---

**CTN Dissemination Librarians routinely scan** journal tables of contents and search databases (PubMed and PsycINFO, e.g.) for newly published CTN-related articles. We also solicit submissions regularly in the *CTN Bulletin*.

We **scan for CTN-related conferences** and solicit CTN-related presentations from authors (e.g. if noted in *CTN Bulletin*). If an author provides the presentation before the conference takes place, we hold the record until after the conference date, and provide a PowerPoint slide with the URL to the CTN Library that can be appended to the presentation.

CTN Dissemination Librarians have also provided **occasional literature searches or special services** for staff of EMMES and DCRI, as well as services requested by CCTN staff and the RUC.

## Publicity/Promotion

---

- Newly added items in Library are highlighted on home page and *What's New* page. An **RSS feed** was added to this page in 2007 so that RSS users could subscribe to receive updates on everything added to the Library.
- **Regular updates** in the *CTN Bulletin* about new items, web site features, or site use stats.
- CTN Dissemination Library **business cards & flyers** distributed at conferences/meetings.
- CTN Dissemination Librarian Meg Brunner will be presenting a **poster about the CTN Dissemination Library** at the Pacific Northwest Chapter of the Medical Library Association conference in Seattle, October 18, 2009.
- A **flyer advertising the upcoming release** of two CTN therapy manuals in the CTN Dissemination Library is being distributed at the Oct. 2009 Steering Committee meeting.

## Update on the Dissemination Workshop Video/CE Quiz Project

---

A draft of the quiz for the workshop video CE project has been created by the CTN Dissemination Librarians using a web tools application called "Catalyst WebQ." However, we are still in the process of refining procedures for the quiz/CE credit process, working with Laurie Krom at the national ATTC. The final versions of the videos from the workshop are forthcoming.

## Updates to the CTN Dissemination Library web site

---

**Training Resources:** A new page was added this summer that lists a variety of training resources for CTN Clinical Staff and other providers. It includes all of the Clinical Coordinating Center web seminars from 2009, as well as links to the Historical Trauma conference videos (July 2008) and the presentations from the July 2009 NIDA-sponsored Electronic Health Record System conference. As more training materials become available, they will be included on this page (e.g. the February 2009 Dissemination Workshop videos). RUC members should feel free to submit any training-related materials they feel it would be useful to include here!

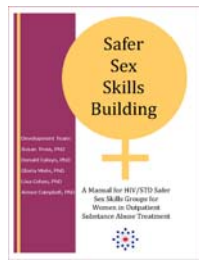

**Outcomes Added to Protocol Pages:** Pages for completed protocols were updated recently to include a brief description of outcomes, as well as the citation and link to the primary outcomes paper in the Library. To date, 18 protocols have outcomes available. The protocol page has become the most-used page on the Library web site this year (not including the home page).

**PMCID/NIHMS Numbers Added:** After a round of progress reports from multiple CTN Nodes were rejected by NIH over the summer due of lack of proper referencing of PMCID and NIHMS numbers, the CTN Dissemination Librarians added this information to every relevant article in the Library (see bottom of the display pages). Records will be checked and updated with incoming PMCID/NIHMS numbers regularly.
